To understand Biblical principles and history in a life-giving way that can be applied to find personal expression and clarity of God’s plan as a leader in the coming harvest through revelatory theology and applied missions as led by the Spirit and the Word of God. This course offers two tracks, revelatory Theology and missions.

To gain a heart of revelation, knowledge, and understanding for one’s contribution to humanity and then to be able to express some part of the whole through a dissertation leading to a book.

CMM College of Theology strives to pioneer transformational theological ministry training with revelatory study in a hybrid classroom setting. Eligible students can graduate in one year with an Associates or Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Studies and progress to a Graduate, Masters, or Doctorate in Theology as well as a Ph.D.

The School of Theology aims to teach fundamental truths of the faith with revelation that prepares students to disciple the world in Spirit and Truth. Dr. Jorge Parrott is the President of the School of Theology. He is also the Missions Director of CM/Missions offers short, mid, and long-term missions placement as well as internships to assist CMM College of Theology students in determining if they are called to missions and seeking their place after graduation, as well as fulfilling their destinies.

The CM Missions network has thousands of missionary leaders serving in 70 nations, equipping national pastors who have planted thousands of churches, schools, orphanages, and medical facilities. Dr. Jorge Parrott is the President of CMM Theology, the President of CMM (Correll Missionary Ministries). CM Missions also handles cross-cultural training, support raising, disaster response, humanitarian aid, including the persecuted church, and donor relations for those serving in missions.

## Distinctives

*We showcase four distinctive that set us apart from other schools.*

1. **Study the Word of God:** We encourage students to engage with Holy Spirit the Revealer to gain a heart of wisdom, revelation and to better understand the character of God, which can help shape the character of the student.

**OUTCOME:** We see students transformed in *their hearts* as they write what speaks to them.

2. **Look to Jesus and honor those who have gone before us:** The Body of Christ has a significant amount of teaching and information available. Many well-known and little-known scholars who have gone before us have dug wells of revelation that we are still drinking from today. One of CMM College of Theology's goals is to understand and taste of those wells and not negate their importance to the contribution they have made to humanity and the Body of Christ. We encourage students to analyze information, with Holy Spirit against the Word of God so that graduates are not afraid to face hard questions, schools of thought or ideas outside their comfort zone. We believe that critical thinking with Holy Spirit is crucial in these times. **We then encourage students to dig their own well of revelation** in a safe environment, to help them find their contribution to the Kingdom that was set before the foundations of the earth.

**OUTCOME:** We see students transformed in their *understanding and knowledge* as they compare what the Bible says and what scholars say.

**3. Friendship Learning/Discussions:** Our students study and prepare for class. They invest and then share during class discussions. This style of learning is a classical Hebrew type of learning called Chavrusa, also spelled chavruta or hehavruta (Aramaic: חֲבֵרֻתָא, lit. “friendship” or “companionship”).

*Chavrusa-style learning puts each student in the position to analyze the text, organize thoughts into logical arguments, explain, reason, hear the other students, question and sharpen each other's ideas, often arriving at entirely new insights into the meaning of the text.*<sup>1</sup>

Our trained instructors facilitate discussions with Holy Spirit to encourage students to clarify their thought process; we don't tell them what to think!

**OUTCOME:** We see students transformed by *wisdom* as they hear others and grow from the experience.

**4. Discovering your path to a fruitful, victorious life:** Many students come to our school hungry to seek out their purpose, to ‘walk out their salvation, and live in the fullness, that the Bible says is ours. We help students discover the path the Lord designed for them as we take these students into the throne room while learning to hear the Holy Spirit and grow in discernment.

**OUTCOME:** We see students transformed by *counsel* as they allow the fullness of the process to lead them to the destiny of good works prepared for ahead of time. (Eph. 2:10)

*Our professors share our desire to ignite a deep hunger for the Lord in a rare and transformative way, not found in any school globally. Our staff has earned the trust and respect of hundreds of our students, and many develop lifetime relationships with our team.*

# STATEMENT OF BELIEFS

The following is a statement of our position of basic Christian doctrines. As once stated by a great missionary, "There are certain basic Christian truths about which there must be agreement. On all other doctrines, there should be liberty. In all things, there must be charity." We resolve to take an uncompromising stand on the essential doctrines of the faith and extend "the right hand of fellowship" to all who hold to them. It is also our resolution to protect the liberty of Christians to hold different perspectives on the "non-essential" doctrines.

There are doctrines we may consider non-essential, but which are essential. We, therefore, make known our belief on these, while presenting them with tolerance toward those who may hold a different position. We are committed to truth and accuracy in doctrine, but also understand that one can hold right doctrines and still do damage to the body of Christ by causing divisions over the non-essentials. We are, therefore, just as committed to the essential Christian character, believing that "In all things, there must be charity." As the apostle stated, "The goal of our instruction is love, from a pure heart and a sincere faith" (I Timothy 1:5). That, too, is our goal and commitment as we promote the following teachings that we hold as truth:

## **ON THE PERSON OF JESUS**

There is only one true God, Who is revealed in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ is the Word (Logos) of God. The Word was with God in the beginning, which states His pre-existence as one with God. "By Him, all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth" (Colossians 1:16), therefore making Jesus the Creator. Jesus Christ is the Purpose of God found in all of creation. He is the Father's delight and desire, and the Father is looking for the reflection of His Son in all created things. Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. In the beginning, it was the ultimate purpose of God for all things to be summed up in Christ (Ephesians 1:10). Jesus Christ, Who pre-existed with God in the form of God, emptied Himself to become fully a man that He might be the propitiatory sacrifice for the sins of mankind. Through His propitiatory sacrifice made on the cross, all who believe in Him and His sacrifice have their sins remitted and are restored to the fellowship with God lost by man's transgression.

Jesus was born of a virgin, by the seed of the Holy Spirit. His virgin birth is a testimony that only the Spirit can beget that which is Spirit. Those of the new creation are not solely of human origin but are born from above by the Holy Spirit. The resurrection of Jesus' physical body after His crucifixion was literal, as will be the resurrection of both the just and the unjust on the Day of Judgment.

"There is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (I Timothy 2:5). All who seek restoration and fellowship with God must go through Jesus and cannot approach God through any person, spirit, or doctrine. It is also a supreme presumption for any person or institution to seek to be a mediator for others in place of Christ Jesus Himself.

The apostolic commission was for His followers to labor until Christ was formed in His church, to present every person complete in Christ, and to manifest the sweet aroma of the knowledge of Him in every place. When Jesus is lifted up, He will draw all people to Himself. We consider it the primary purpose of the church to esteem and exalt Jesus in every way. It is the focus and devotion of CM Missions to know and preach Him, and not ourselves. We pray for the grace to continually respond to His call to return to our first Love, that we might passionately devote ourselves to pleasing Him in all things while preparing for His return.

## **ON MAN**

Humankind, male and female were created in the image of God, without sin or the knowledge of good and evil. The first man, Adam, transgressed the command of God, and as God had warned, the process of death entered him and all of his descendants because of that transgression. Therefore, all have sinned and are worthy of the sentence of death. Because of our unrighteousness, we are unable to approach a holy God, except through the atoning sacrifice of Jesus. Through Jesus, we not only can come before the Throne of Grace, but we may approach it boldly since our confidence is not in ourselves but in the Lord Jesus.

## Our Program Basis

We have abbreviated our requirements for graduate and postgraduate degrees in an effort to hold the tuition to a minimum and allow busy ministers and working students every opportunity for higher Spirit-filled, prophetic, Christian education. It is the desire CMM College of Theology to mix the Word with the Spirit out of a deep well of the rich prophetic heritage that CMM offers. Each year is a complete package for the degree.

## Curriculum and Reference Material

The CMM College of Theology seeks to offer the highest quality curriculum and reference materials. Resources are subject to change at the discretion of our faculty leaders. Not all subjects are taught every year.

## Student and Faculty Nondiscrimination Policy

The CMM College of Theology admits students of all races, color national and ethnic origin with all rights, privileges, programs, and activates made available to students of CMM College of Theology. CMM College of Theology does not discriminate based on race, color, national, or ethical origin in administration of its policies, loan policies, or other school-administered programs.

## Statement Standards-Code of Conduct

All students are required to give a testimony of having accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. Each student is expected to conduct himself/herself in a manner that will, at no time, bring reproach upon our Savior or CMM.

## Accreditation

*If the sole purpose of needing an education is for the Gospel ministry or related field within Christian ministry, secular accreditation is not necessary or required. All Christian churches accept quality Christian education regardless of which accreditation group, if any of the referenced institutions belong. If study is for purpose other than ministry, such as business administrator, engineer, lawyer etc., Students should apply to an institution that belongs to a regional accrediting association. In secular education, regional accreditation is essential! For education of those in Christian service, secular accreditation does little more than typically make the tuition beyond the reach of most ministers.*

*CMM College of Theology provides associate, bachelor, master, and doctor degrees. We have been able to secure full accreditation through two sources which are private accrediting to keep tuition cost at a minimum. We have a full school accreditation (see #1) and continue to maintain a satellite school status of NCCT. (see #2)*

We hold an exempt status with the state of South Carolina as our degrees are ministry degrees and not a liberal arts.

Section 59-58-30 of the law states that the definition of a “nonpublic educational institution” does not include “(4) Institutions whose sole purpose is religious or theological training.”*

## **Definition of credit hour**

CMM meets the necessary standard requirement regarding the number of classroom hours or the equivalent per earned credit hour. We maintain 15 classroom hours to equal one semester hour through reverse classroom experience. Students will work outside of class and then attend online discussions.

## **Requirements for Admission**

To consider your application for admission, the following is to be understood and submitted:

- Students must be 18 years of age or older and profess Christ as Lord.
- Students must have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- All materials must be in English.
- Submit your official application for admission online at <https://CMMtheology.org>
- You must be proficient in the English language and have a minimum TOEFL score of 70 on the internet-based test, or 523 on the paper-based test.

## **Honorary Degree**

Honorary degrees are only awarded by CMM College of Theology through **rare** and exceptional service and work in the Kingdom of God. The body of work and life of the person are considered in such matters. This being said, is a consideration of the current and past work and writings, not future life choices or changes that may occur.

Potential students may submit requests to the President or Dean. However, the President reserves the right to accept or deny the request. We have refused far more than we have approved. CMM College of Theology is not

generous with this particular degree as only a few have earned it. The majority of our doctoral degrees are students that complete the full program. This is a very honorable degree and should be treated as such.

## Transferred Credits

CMM College of Theology reserves the right to allow credits earned at other institutions for similar courses taken at that institution. If credit is awarded, the candidate will be assessed \$2.00 per credit hour. These hours may not exceed 60% of the required hours for graduation from CMM College of Theology.

## Graduation

To graduate, students will have completed the academic, attendance, and financial requirements for the year with excellence and godly character. Those who complete the first year with high distinction will be granted automatic admission into the next year. **High distinction:** *Completed all assignments with a 3.5 or higher; Paid tuition in full within the due dates; Attended 90% of classes and upholds the values of CMM.*

## Grading Criteria

CMM assigns credits to each course. The core subjects are graded on an 8 point grading system. A grade of 70% is considered the minimum passing grade. Other CMM assessments and requirements will be given a pass/no-pass grade. All grades will contribute to an overall GPA.

A = 3.6 - 4.0 .....	Superior
B = 3.2 - 3.59.....	Excellent
C = 2.18 - 3.19.....	Average
Below C .....	Incomplete

## Submission of Assessment

Completed assessments are to be submitted on the due date via the “Classroom” interface.

## Due Dates

Each assessment has a Due Date. These are spread over the academic year to allow for a manageable course load. Completed assessments must be submitted by the due dates. Late submissions will lose a grade of 10% for each day the assessment is late. Students must gain competency in all failed assessments and subjects to be granted eligibility for graduation. The ability to resubmit a failed assessment or repeat a failed subject will be at the discretion of the instructor.

## Extensions

A student may apply for an extension to the submission date of an assessment. The request for extension must be submitted to the instructor no less than two days before the due date and must demonstrate exceptional

circumstances (for example, significant trauma, extended sickness, death in the family, NOT poor time management, computer malfunction, and the like). Approval is based on the discretion of the instructor.

## **Application Fees and Tuition**

A non-refundable application fee of \$60 must accompany all applications. Upon approval of the application, 20% is due at REGISTRATION. The remaining balance of tuition and other applicable fees MUST be paid in full by April 15th of each school year. A 10% discount on the annual tuition is applicable if all fees are paid in advance and no later than Oct 1.

## **Refund Policy**

Students may change or drop a program at any time during the first week after notification of their acceptance into CMM College of Theology. When a program is dropped or withdrawn from and no substitute is taken, a 10% refund will be made upon request. No refunds are given for workbooks. Students must notify CMM College of Theology in writing, of the intention to withdraw or drop a program, with no refunds on doctoral degrees.

# **STUDENT GRIEVANCES**

## **Informal Resolution**

We use the Biblical method of resolution according to Matthew 18:15-17

*“If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church.”*

The student is strongly encouraged to discuss his or her grievance with the person alleged to have caused the problem. This discussion should be held as soon as the student first becomes aware of the act or condition that is the basis of the grievance. Additionally, or in the alternative, the student may wish to present his or her grievance in writing to the person alleged to have caused the grievance. In either case, the person alleged to have caused the grievance must respond to the student promptly, either orally or in writing.

## **Escalation of Grievance**

If the student is not satisfied with the response, he or she may present the grievance in writing to the director of the department. Any such written grievance must be received by the Administrator not later than forty-five calendar days after the student first became aware of the facts which gave rise to the grievance. (If the grievance is against the director of a department, the student should address his or her grievance to the next level of authority. At this level, a fact-finding investigating should take place.

Based upon the report of the information found, the Administrator shall make a determination and submit his or her decision in writing to the student and to the person alleged to have caused the grievance within ten calendar days of receipt of the report. The written determination shall include the reasons for the decision, shall indicate remedial action to be taken if any, and shall inform the student of rights to seek review by the Director.

## Appeal Procedures

Within ten calendar days of receipt of the administrator's decision, a student who is not satisfied with the response of the administrator after the escalation may seek further review by submitting the written grievance, together with the administrator's written decision, to the Director.

## Financial Information

A non-refundable application fee of \$60 must be submitted with the application. 20% of the tuition is also due on the first day of school. Please note that these fees must be paid before entering the class. The balance of tuition and any other fees must be paid by April 15th each year. CMM College of Theology graduation is scheduled at the end of May 2021. *Graduation and books not included in tuition.*

Transcripts: \$25 is due for each transcript upon request. Transcript will be mailed directly to the requesting institution.

## Associates/Bachelors of Ministry in Biblical Studies

Our goal is to take knowledge and couple it with spiritual growth to equip all students, to be able to live and express Biblical truth effectively the contemporary world. CMM College of Theology courses are optimal for growth and maturity. The live discussion and written work is transformative. We value the students participation.

### Associates and Bachelor Ministry Credits

The first year is an Associate degree in of Ministry in Biblical Studies and the second is a Bachelor degree of Ministry in Biblical Studies. The full bachelor's degree is a 120 credit Bachelors of Ministry in Biblical Studies degree, and to graduate with a bachelor degree students need to earn the full 120 credits. This is a ministry degree, not a liberal degree. Successful completion of the assigned elective for the associates year.

- **30 credits** awarded for the successful completion of the associate program with a 2.5 or higher out of a 4.00 GPA.
  - **15 credits** awarded for the successful completion of the Supernatural Identity Module the associate year with a 2.5 or higher out of a 4.00 GPA.
- **30 credits** awarded for the successful completion of the bachelor program with a 2.5 or higher out of a 4.00 GPA.
  - **15 credits** awarded may be awarded for the successful completion of the assigned electives for the bachelor year with a 2.5 or higher out of a 4.00 GPA.
- **30 credits** for practicum (*eligibility below*) (15 for Associate and 15 for Bachelor year practicum)

## **Practicum Explained: *Two Year Requirements and Assumptions***

**30 credits** may be awarded for practicum of ministry experience. We have a detailed manual for the student and school that track the ministry work or mission trip experience that you are doing or have done to receive these credits. CMM College of Theology provides the manual for the practicum.

**30 credit hours of practicum** (1 credit = 15 actual hours of supervised activity or work or mission trips). **450 actual** hours of experience or 6 months part-time ministry or 12 weeks full-time ministry. This can be split between the associate and bachelor year.

### **BREAKDOWN BY YEAR: ASSOCIATES YEAR CREDITS EXPLAINED**

If a student enters at the Associate level, to graduate, they would need to complete the class year with a 2.50, out of a 4.00 which gives them 30 credits. They would also need to complete 15 practicum credit hours (**225 actual hours** of ministry or mission trips) and 15 Supernatural Identity Module credit hours.

### **BACHELOR YEAR CREDITS EXPLAINED**

If a student comes to CMM College of Theology with an Associate degree or the equivalent, desiring to enter the Bachelor year, 15 credits for practicum and 15 credits for Supernatural Identity are assumed. In other words, we are assuming 60 credits have been satisfied before they enter the bachelor year.

Students then entering at the Bachelor level wishing to graduate, would need to complete the class year with a 2.50 out of a 4.00, which gives them 30 credits. They would also need to complete 15 practicum credit hours (**225 actual hours** of ministry or mission trips) and 15 Supernatural Foundation credit hours.

For the Bachelor student only, 15 credit hours are assigned for the Bachelor level in **Supernatural Foundations**. An 8 credit hours are assigned with "Firm Foundations" by Bob Weiner, and 7 credit hours are assigned electives in Supernatural Financial Responsibility.

Our goal is to take knowledge and couple it with spiritual growth to equip all students to be able to live and express Biblical truth effectively in the contemporary world.

The Bachelor of Ministry in Biblical Studies provides students with an appreciation of the history, context, and the message of the Bible. The prerequisite for the Bachelor degree is an Associate degree. Therefore, it takes two years to complete the Bachelor degree. This program prepares and equips the student with a firm foundation in principle and text.

## ASSOCIATE OF MINISTRY *in Biblical Studies*

### **1 CR ABS 101 BASIC CHRISTIANITY MODULE**

#### **INTRO TO FAITH IN CHRIST**

##### **Course Description**

This is a fundamental review of the tenets of the Christian faith in Christ Jesus. We cover the non-negotiable subjects as well as have discussions of current trends. *1 credit=25-30 class hrs/ homework*

### **3 CR ABS 102-103 JOHN'S LETTERS MODULE**

#### **ABS 102 GOSPEL OF JOHN**

##### **Course Description**

This is both a historical and spiritual study of John and his intimate place with Jesus.

#### **ABS 103 EPISTLES OF JOHN**

##### **Course Description**

This study continues to study the Love of God in a revelatory way.

### **3 CR ABS 104 SYNOPTIC GOSPELS MODULE**

#### **ABS 104 SYNOPTIC GOSPELS**

##### **Course Description**

This study of the three gospels, Matthew, Mark, and Luke, are presented in chronological order and gives us a broad brush of the life of Christ.

### **3CR ABS 105 APOSTOLIC HISTORY MODULE**

#### **ABS 105 ACTS**

##### **Course Description**

This study includes the supernatural works of the early church and their application today.

### **12 CR ABS 106-111 PAULINE EPISTLES MODULE**

#### **ABS 106 I AND II THESSALONIANS**

##### **Course Description**

Persecution is a current theme in our time. Yet foreign to the Western mind. In this class, we study how to "excel still more" during persecution for the faith. CMM is a mission-based school with deep roots in covert nations. We bring first-hand experience into the classroom as we study Paul's encouragement to stand firm in Christ.

#### **ABS 107 I CORINTHIANS AND II CORINTHIANS**

##### **Course Description**

This is a historical study of Paul's letters to the Corinthians during 55-56 A.D. We look at the conflicts, resolutions and gain insight and the application today.

#### **ABS 103 GALATIANS**

##### **Course Description**

In this study of the church in Galatia, we will look at the history and what it means to be free in Christ and not under the law of Moses.

#### **ABS 109 EPHESIANS**

##### **Course Description**

How do we live a life worthy of Christ? Here we study Paul's instructions given to the church on grace, peace, and salvation.

#### **ABS 110 PHILIPPIANS, COLOSSIANS, PHILEMON**

##### **Course Description**

In this study, we look at the joy of suffering as Christ and identity in Christ. These are big topics and worthy of a lifetime of study. It is our prayer that this class will open doors of revelation for new pathways of understanding.

#### **ABS 111 I AND II TIMOTHY AND TITUS**

##### **Course Description**

This study will look at discipleship, the cost, and the blessings of the "laid down life" for Christ.

### **3 CR ABS 113-114 FAITH AND TRUTH IN HARDSHIP MODULE**

#### **ABS 113 I AND II PETER AND JUDE**

##### **Course Description**

This study will allow the student to see the importance of Truth, even in hardship, growing in faith, and standing on promises. It is our hope and belief that this becomes a lifestyle.

#### **ABS 114 BOOK OF JAMES**

##### **Course Description**

This is a study of faith in action. This is not faith for salvation. We will see that faith flows out of the love relationship with the Lord.

### **5 CR ABS 112 LITERATURE REVIEW PART 1 AND FINAL PAPER**

#### **ABS 112 LITERATURE REVIEW PART 1 AND FINAL PAPER**

##### **Course Description**

A literature review is an integral part of writing. Whether books or thesis, we need to gather our sources and understand what God is saying through it. This is a beginner level, and the student will write a 3,000-4,000-word formal paper on the life of Pau

### **15CR ABS 124 SUPERNATURAL IDENTITY MODULE**

This block can be completed in the summer before or after class starts.

##### **Description**

Students may start at the beginning of the Associates or Bachelor year with the study questions and journal weekly. Students can work through videos, and books when time permits, This course will culminate in an 1000-1500 word essay paper.

<b>Goal</b>	To gain deeper insight into God's character in OT and how that applies in developing our character, to hear God in scripture and daily life more clearly, and to gain a basic understanding of the feasts and God's timetable.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	An associate's degree or the equivalent with a 2.50 GPA or higher out of a 4.00
<b>Graduation requirements</b>	120 undergraduate credit hours with a 2.50 GPA of a 4.00, (accomplished by passing the bachelor school year, the practicum and supernatural foundation)

## **8 CR BBS 201-205 PENTATEUCH/TORAH MODULE**

### **BBS 201-205 GENESIS, EXODUS, LEVITICUS, NUMBERS AND DEUTERONOMY**

#### **Course Description**

The "Torah" is the 5 books of Moses (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy). The "Pentateuch" is Greek and means "Five Books," which refers to the 5 Books of Moses. This course will cover each book with supplemental reading and study. A paper will be required for each book along with study questions.

## **2 CR BBS 206 BASIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE MODULE**

### **BBS 206 BOOK OF ROMANS**

#### **Course Description**

This study will compare and contrast the old and new covenant along with the foundational doctrine of the Christian faith. This is a foundation for further study in the master class. We will also study what modern scholars say.

## **5 CR BBS 210-211 EARLY ISRAELITE HISTORY MODULE PT 1: HISTORICAL BOOKS/PROPHETS**

### **BBS 210 JOSHUA**

#### **Course Description**

This is a historical and spiritual study of the journey of Israel; it's heroes, and the loving God who led them and continues to lead us today.

### **BBS 211 JUDGES AND RUTH**

#### **Course Description**

This historical and spiritual study of God's mighty deliverance during a time of Israel's cyclic falling away and return. These books provide great inspiration for the believer.

## **13 CR BBS 207 -209 ESCHATOLOGY BASICS AND FINAL PAPER**

### **BBS 207 DANIEL**

#### **Course Description**

We begin our study by looking at the historical placement of this book as we look at each chapter. We then jump into basic eschatology looking at the 70 weeks.

### **BBS 208 REVELATION**

#### **Course Description**

This is a study of the book of Revelation in the historical placement, relationship to Jesus, and how it pertains to end-time events. We look and listen to other scholars and different points of view to better understand the discussion in the church.

### **BBS 209 REVELATION LITERATURE REVIEW AND FINAL PAPER**

#### **Course Description**

It is crucial to understand how to dig and study relevant information concerning end-time events. Students can pick their topic as it pertains to end-time events and the Book of Revelation and develop a formal paper, 5-7,000-word.

## **2 CR BBS 212 OLD TESTAMENT LITERATURE MODULE PART 2: WISDOM/KETUVIM**

### **BBS 212 PROVERBS**

#### **Course Description**

This is a study and survey of the book of Proverbs, historical, and daily application for transformation.

**15 cr BBS 214 BACHELOR SUPERNATURAL FOUNDATION MODULE**

This block can be completed in the summer before or after class starts.

**Course Description**

We need Supernatural Foundations in our lives no matter how old we are in the natural and spiritual. Below is the breakdown of the combined class.

**Course Description**

“Firm Foundations” Bob and Rose Weiner, supplemental workbook. (extra cost applies, \$20 shipped book)

# GRADUATE DEGREES

## Master of Ministry in Biblical Studies: Year 1

## Master of Theology/Missions in Biblical Studies: Year 2

## Master of Divinity: Year 3

For the two-year, 60-68 credit master degree, our desire is to go higher in revelation, intimacy and hearing God and the Word through our personal study, prayer time, writing and discussion, then to see transformation in our lives spilling out to the place in which we are called.

The prerequisite for the master degree is a bachelor degree with a 2.5 average or higher. The student will complete the Master 1 or Master in Ministry, which is one year. The successful student will be eligible to complete the degree by enrolling in the 2nd year master class. In the first year we delve into the prophets and beginning theology not just to understand process but to see where the church is today and to find out where God is calling her. In the second year students can choose a focus track.

NOTE: FOR THE MASTER IN DIVINITY, WE ARE WORKING TO FINISH THAT THIS YEAR.

- **Focus 1:** Theology
- **Focus 2:** Missions

The focus tracks are about 6 weeks of classes that students will follow then come back together. The final paper will be on one of these focus topics. The rest of the classes are shared by both groups for a well-rounded year.

## Master of Ministry in Biblical Studies

We will compare and contrast the prophets with current prophets. This is a year of discovery and a more profound revelation in doctrine. We will look at some basic foundations and a few current prophetic voices, as well. The final project is a paper on revelatory theology. This program prepares and equips the student with critical thinking and personal revelation for the ministry and ministry of life.

<b>Goal</b>	To help the student better understand the prophets in the Bible through the Spirit of God, in their timeline; to see current prophets and gain a heart of discernment and maturity in personally hearing God, and to study theology in a revelatory way in the Word of God and by His Spirit. All set in an environment for the student to gain deeper insight for a life of ministry, whether in a secular job or an actual ministry position.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Bachelor degree with a 2.5 GPA or higher. Students may be eligible for entrance given education experience.
<b>Graduation Requirements</b>	30 graduate credit hours beyond the bachelor degree, with a 2.50 GPA of a 4.00, (accomplished by passing this course)

### “MOED” OR OUR APPOINTMENT WITH GOD/PROPHETIC MODULE

#### **1 CR MIM 301 FEASTS-CURRENT EVENTS & BIBLICAL IMPLICATIONS**

##### **Course Description**

This Brief overview is a discussion of why are we here, as we look over the landscape of what is and what was, can give us direction of where we are going, where we fit, and what the Bible says about it.

#### **3 CR MIM - 302 WHAT IS A PROPHET PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE**

##### **Course Description**

In this module, we explore the Current Events, the Biblical examples of a prophet, and the prophetic ministry. We then look at the timeline and how the OT prophets interacted with the kings and people of their day. We then look at current prophetic trends, ministries, and the effects on the Body of Christ and humanity as a whole. This course includes a prophetic, revelatory activation.

#### **1 CR MIM - 303 HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF ISRAEL AND TIMELINE**

##### **Course Description**

In this brief overview, we will look at the history of Israel. This study looks at leadership in the Old Testament, in a revelatory study as we look at the kings of Israel and Judah during the united and divided kingdom era and their implication and application today. This class lays a foundation for the historical and spiritual study of OT history.

### 900-800 BC: PROPHETS & KINGS

#### **2 CR MIM 304 THE KINGS OF ISRAEL AND JUDAH-THE DIVIDED KINGDOM**

##### **Course Description**

A survey of the books of Kings and Chronicles that looks at the life and times of the kings, their choices, decisions, and relationships.

### 800-700 BC: OT PROPHETS & KINGS

*(Major and Minor Prophets and Kings)*

#### **5 CR MIM 305 800-700 BC OT PROPHETS AND ISRAEL'S HISTORY**

##### **Course Description**

These classes look at both major and minor prophets and their historical and chronological order as far as is known today. This is a study of their interaction with the kings, each other, and people of their day and how these prophets made a difference before and during the fall of the Northern Kingdom. We will look at how this applies to us today as we seek to understand what God is saying through these scriptures. We will look briefly at Elijah and Elisha; Joel; we will compare and contrast Jonah and Nahum; we will study Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, and Micah.

## **700-586 BC: OT PROPHETS MODULE (MAJOR AND MINOR PROPHETS)**

### **5 cr MIM 306 700-586 BC OT PROPHETS**

#### **Course Description**

These classes look at both major and minor prophets during 700-586 BC and their historical and chronological order as far as is known today. This is a study of their interaction with the kings, each other, and people of their day and how these prophets made a difference before and during the fall of the Southern Kingdom. We will look at how this applies to us today as we seek to understand what God is saying through these scriptures. We will study Zephaniah & Habakkuk, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Obadiah.

## **530-430 BC: A POST EXILE MODULE**

### **3 CR MIM 307 POST EXILIC**

#### **Course Description**

This class looks at the Post Exilic period of Israel. We again look at the timeline from a historical, governmental, spiritual, prophetic, and revelatory perspective. In these classes, we study the books of Ezra, Haggai, Zechariah, Esther, and Nehemiah and their application in their time and ours.

## **OLD TESTAMENT LITERATURE MODULE PART 3: WISDOM/KETUVIM**

### **2 CR MIM 308 THE BOOK OF JOB**

#### **Course Description**

This is a powerful and revelatory study on human suffering, faith, and the power of God. We take a closer look at the "accuser" and the eternal implications concerning man's relationship with God and man.

## **REVELATORY THEOLOGY MODULE PART 1**

### **8 CR MIM 309 LITERATURE REVIEW AND FINAL RESEARCH PAPER (ANALYSIS AND SYNTHESIS OF THEOLOGICAL TOPICS)**

#### **Course Description**

This study opens up new revelatory vistas for the student as they research and develop basic theological topics with the Bible and scholars. Students learn how to put a literature review together to form a final paper as well. This class makes theology not only enlightening but a treasure hunt. A 7,000 to 12,500-word formal thesis and presentation will be the culmination of this course.

# MASTER of Theology/Missions, in Biblical Studies

This is degree will take one year to complete. You must have a Master in Ministry or the equivalent to begin the Master in Theology. The second year of the master degree offers a higher level of analysis and synthesis of the Bible, theology or missions, and church history. The perspective is both personal and global, helping the student to find a more intimate walk with the Lord. The students get to choose a focus, theology or missions.

<b>Goal</b>	To understand Biblical principles and its history in a life-giving way that can be applied to the future, helping students clarify God’s plan and their place in the coming harvest through revelatory theology in the Word of God and by His Spirit. This course offers two tracks, revelatory Theology and revelatory missions.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Master of Ministry in Biblical Studies with a 2.5 GPA or higher. Students may be eligible for entrance given education experience.
<b>Graduation Requirements</b>	60 graduate credit hours beyond the bachelor degree, with a 2.50 GPA of a 4.00, (accomplished by passing this 30 graduate credit course)

## “MOED” OR OUR APPOINTMENT WITH GOD MODULE

The second year of the master class begins with current events and Biblical feasts and is discussion based on what God is doing today in light of the Bible. We look at God’s appointments with leaders during the events between the testaments, considering when society and social norms changed, as well as AD 70 with the persecution of the day and current implications. This module is a basic and broad-brush look at the church timeline, including current events.

### 1 CR MTH 401 FEASTS-CURRENT EVENTS & BIBLICAL IMPLICATIONS

#### Course Description

This Brief overview is a discussion of why are we here, as we look over the landscape of what is and what was, can give us direction of where we are going, and where we fit.

### 1 CR MTH 402 BETWEEN THE TESTAMENTS

#### Course Description

A brief study of the time between the testaments, the implications, and applications today.

### 1CR MTH 403 AD 70

#### Course Description

A brief study of the fall of Jerusalem and the implications and applications today

### 3 CR MTH-404 HEBREWS

#### Course Description

This is a revelatory study of faith and the journey of Israel modeled for the modern Christian.

## HISTORICAL BOOKS / PROPHETS MODULE PART 2 (OT LEADERSHIP)

This study looks at **prophetic leadership**, in a revelatory study as we look Samuel, Saul and David and the implications for their timeline as well as ours today.

### 3 CR MTH 405 BOOKS OF SAMUEL

#### Course Description

A survey of the books of Samuel looks at the life and times of Samuel, Saul, and David, their choices, decisions, and relationships.

## CHURCH HISTORY MODULE

This module is a basic survey of Christian church history with an emphasis on the movements of Holy Spirit and generals of the faith. We compare and contrast this with world religions.

### 4 CR MTH 406 SURVEY OF CHURCH HISTORY

#### Course Description

A basic look at Church History and worldview.

### 1 CR MTH 407 SURVEY OF WORLD RELIGIONS AND APPLIED MISSIONS

#### Course Description

A brief study of world religions from a Christian perspective.

### 1 CR MTH 408 GOD’S GENERALS

#### Course Description

Study the lives of those who went before us to get a rich understanding of the Christian faith as well as the call on your own life.

## REVELATORY THEOLOGY PT 2

### 1 CR MTH 409 DEFENDING THE FAITH

#### Course Description

Basic introduction and look at defending the faith. This course makes apologetics more accessible and enjoyable to study.

### 1 CR MTH 410 PRACTICAL BIBLICAL INTERPRETATION

#### Course Description

Study of pastoral and heart hermeneutics through application in real-life situations.

## COMMUNICATION MODULE

Communicating what you hear from God and in His timing is important. There are many means of doing this and these course will explore a few and offer resources to help grow your skills.

### 1 CR MTH 411 COMMUNICATION

#### Course Description

This course will look at different forms of communication, speaking, writing, media and offer tools and resources to get you moving to a greater confidence in communications.

### 2 CR MTH 412 EVANGELISM, DISCIPLESHIP AND YOU

#### Course Description

How do you share the Gospel and disciple? How does this affect you personally and what is God calling you to do?

## 10 CR THEOLOGY OR MISSIONS FOCUS BLOCK

Students can choose either theology or a missions focus for 6 actual classes in the fall. The students will write their final paper on the work assigned during those classes.

### MTH 414 THEOLOGY PT 2 MODULE

#### Course description

This course will take the student into a deeper understanding of important topics such as the kingdom, ecclesia, Jesus, the blood and more. Students are always surprised to see that as they delve into these topics deeper what they have learned in the past doesn't always line up with what the Word says and even more surprised how it applies to their lives, work and ministry. A 8,000-12,500-word formal thesis and presentation will be the culmination of this course.

### MTH 415 MISSIONS & THE HARVEST MODULE

#### Course description

This course will take the student into a deeper understanding of Missions in the 21. century. We will look at what is needed for understanding to be able to produce lasting fruit by raising up and equipping of current and future leaders to impact their sphere of influence to bring transformation in the individual, community and nation. A 8,000-12,500-word formal thesis and presentation will be the culmination of this course.

### MTH 413 THEOLOGY AND MISSIONS LITERATURE REVIEW- FINAL RESEARCH PAPER (*analysis and synthesis of theological topics or missional topics, depending on focus*)

#### Course Description

This study opens up new revelatory vistas for the student as they research and develop basic theological or missions topics with the Bible and scholars. Students learn how to put a literature review together to form a final paper as well. This course makes theology and missions not only enlightening but a treasure hunt.

## DOCTORATE COURSES

The first year students earn a Doctor of Ministry which is a research ministry degree. This is designed for theological scholarship and study. This degree is considered to be the student's contribution to the Body of Christ. Students may opt for a second year to receive a Doctorate of Theology or Ph.D.

It is our hope and encouragement that after the academic dissertation is complete, students publish their work as a book. We believe that the Lord has books that He is waiting for His children to write. The goal is to write out of the intimate relationship the student has with the Lord. *(A copy of all dissertations will remain in the school library.)*

## 1st Year Doctor of Ministry

<b>Goal</b>	For the doctoral candidate to present themselves before the Lord to better understand their contribution to the <b>body of Christ</b> . Then to be able to express some part of the whole through a dissertation leading to a book.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Master degree with a 3.00 GPA or higher out of a 4.00. Students may be eligible for entrance given education experience.
<b>Graduation requirements</b>	Students must earn at least 30 graduate credit hours with a 3.00 GPA beyond the Master of Theology or the equivalent, accomplished by: attending classes; passing assignments, and writing the dissertation with a 3.00 GPA.

### 40 CR D.Min. 501 DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

#### Course description

This course is self-paced research program that compels the student to study and find their voice. Our courses are times of refreshing and encouragement to help build and foster community. This project will be the students **contribution to the Body of Christ**. The project will culminate with a 25,000-38,000 word (100 pages), dissertation to be presented before the class and defended before the review board.

\*Electives upon submission and approval of the students application will be sent to the candidate after review of education and experience.

Electives typically include one or both:

1. 3 Books the student is reading for their dissertation.
  - They are to write 3 separate informal essay papers on 3 of the books they found as they are preparing to write their dissertation. Students are to express what they learned when reading each books, approx. 1,000 words.
2. Books assigned to fill in gaps that the school leaders feel necessary for the growth of the student
  - The student is to write separate informal essay papers on books assigned by instructors to express what they learned when reading the book, approx. 1,000 words.

## 2nd Year Doctor of Theology/Ph.D.

<b>Goal</b>	For the doctoral candidate to present themselves before the Lord to better understand their contribution to <b>humanity</b> and then to be able to express some part of the whole through a dissertation leading to a book.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Doctorate degree with a 3.00 GPA or higher out of a 4.00. Students may be eligible for entrance given education experience.
<b>Graduation requirements</b>	Students must earn at least 30 graduate credit hours with a 3.00 GPA beyond the Doctor of Ministry or the equivalent, a total of 60 graduate credit hours beyond the master degree, accomplished by: attending classes; passing assignments, and writing the dissertation with a 3.00 GPA

*\*\*Electives maybe assigned if the graduate committee feels necessary.*

### 40 CR THD 601 DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

#### **Course description**

Doctor of Theology or the Ph.D. is a research ministry degree. This degree is to be considered a **contribution to humanity**. This course is self-paced research program that compels the student to study and find their voice. Our courses are times of refreshing and encouragement to help build and foster community. This project will be the students contribution to humanity. The project will culminate with a *55-72,000-word (around 200 to 250 pages)*, dissertation to be presented before the class and defended before the review board.


